Qualifying Medical Conditions

- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Crohn's Disease
- Depression

- Panic Disorder
- Parkinson's Disease
- Persistent nausea
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Sickle Cell Anemia
- Spasticity associated with Multiple Sclerosis or spinal cord injury
- A terminal illness
- Tourette's Syndrome
- Condition causing chronic or intractable pain

• Cancer related cachexia, nausea or vomiting, weight loss

• Epilepsy or a condition causing seizures • HIV/AIDS - related nausea or weight loss

- Oral tablet, capsule, tincture • Non-sugarcoated gelatinous cube, gelatinous
- rectangular cuboid, or lozenge
- Gel, oil, cream, or topical preparation
- Suppository
- Transdermal patch
- Nebulizer
- Liquid or oil for administration using an inhaler

Allowed **Products**

Products NOT Allowed

• Raw plant material

• Products that could be smoked or vaped • Food products such as cookies or candies

Hold active license to practice medicine

Complete 4 hour course on medical cannabis

Meet additional qualifications established by the State Board of Medical Examiners

Patient Registry System

Does all of the following:

- 1. Receives and records physician certification
- 2. Tracks qualified patient and caregiver registration
- 3. Information relating to conditions and dosage
- 4. Verifies card is current
- 5. Tracks purchases made by dispensary, date, time, amount, and type
- 6. Interfaces with seed-to-sale tracking system
- 7. Provides access to
 - State and local law enforcement
 - $_{\circ}$ Health care practitioners
 - Registered certifying physicians
 - $_{\circ}$ Dispensaries
 - o The State Board of Medical Examiners
 - Licensed pharmacists



Medical Canabis Card

Includes the following information

- Identifying Information:
 - $_{\circ}\,$ name, address, and date of birth
- Photo
- Identity as patient or caregiver
- Expiration date
- Statement "This card is only valid in the State of Alabama"

All phases of medical cannabis production will take place within Alabama's borders.

Record test results for pesticides, microbials, and THC content.

Tag viable plants

with a unique ID

Record trim, waste, and harvest.

Create detailed transport manifest.

Manufacture raw cannabis into new products.

Cannabis Business License Types



Cultivator Up to 12 Licenses



Dispensary

Up to 4 Licenses Each licensee can operate up to 3 locations.



State Testing Laboratory No License Limits



Processor Up to 4 Licenses



Secure Transporter No License Limits



Integrated Facility

Up to 5 Licenses

Authorizes the Licensee to cultivate, process, transport and dispense medical cannabis.



Cultivation

No more than 12 Licenses

Authorizes:

• License for cultivation only

• Sale or transfer to processor

• Sale or transfer of processed cannabis to a dispensary



Processor

No more than 4 Licenses

Authorizes:

- Purchase or transfer of cannabis from cultivation
- Processing of cannabis including packaging and labeling
- Sale or transfer to dispensary



Dispensary

No more than 4 Licenses |Operate up to 3 sites

Authorizes:

- Purchase/Transfer from processor
- Purchase/Transfer from cultivator
- Purchase/Transfer from integrated facility
- Dispensing/Sale only to patient or caregiver
- Transfer to/from licensed state testing lab

Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter to the contrary, the commission shall not permit a dispensary to operate a dispensing site in any municipality or unincorporated area of a county unless the municipality or county has authorized the operation of dispensing sites within its boundaries, as provided in subdivision (2).



Secure Transporter

No limit on licenses

Authorizes:

• Secure Transporter License authorizes to store and transport cannabis for a fee.

• A license <u>does not authorize</u> transport to a registered qualified patient or registered caregiver.



State Testing Laboratory

No license limit

Authorizes:

- The ability to possess and test
- Important Note: Cannabis products will be tested at every phase of production



Integrated Facility

No more than 5 licenses

May operate up to 5 dispensing sites

Authorizes:

- Cultivation
- Processing
- Dispensing/Sale
- Transporting
- Sale/transfer to independent dispensary

Award of Licenses (Cultivator, Secure Transporter, Processor, Dispensary, and State Testing Laboratory)

December 12

Award of Licenses (Integrated Facility)

December 28


Commission Meeting Consideration of imposing stay on issuance of some or all awarded licenses

January 9


